

from a point 288 metres north-west of the centre-line of its junction with Skaigh Road north-westwards for a distance of 618 metres, will cease to be a restricted road for speed limit purposes. Thus the 30 m.p.h. speed limit recently imposed as a consequence of the installation of street lighting would revert to the national limit of 60 m.p.h. which applied prior to the provision of the lighting system.
