TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 31st January 1986, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 3rd February 1986, to Friday, 7th February 1986 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders. (7 SD)

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL REGULATIONS 1976

Pedestrianisation of a length of Busk Road, Oldham

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of Oldham Borough Council he has made an Order entitled "The Conversion of Highways into Footpaths or Bridleways (County of Greater Manchester) (No. 4) Order 1985". The Order comes into operation on 28th January 1986 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to the Order) on a length of Busk Road, Oldham.
