Part of Footpath 88 between Courtaild Road and Southend Arterial Road

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981 has made an Order extinguishing as from the date of the Order the public rights of way over the following rights of way, shown coloured blue on the map hereinafter referred to:

That part of footpath 88 extending northwards from its junction with Courtauld Road (point A on the map), for a distance of 650 feet, then extending westwards for a distance of 100 feet, then extending northwards for a distance of 570 feet to its junction with the Southend Arterial Road (point B on the map).

Laindon, West of High Road

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981 has made an Order extinguishing as from the date of the Order the public rights of way over the following rights of way, shown coloured blue on the map hereinafter referred to:

That part of Manor Road, extending westwards from its junction with High Road (point A on the map), for a distance of 275 feet to point B on the map.

That part of Aston Road, extending westwards from a point 65 feet west of its junction with High Road (point C on the map), for a distance of 220 feet to its junction with Brimsdon Avenue (point D on the map).

Brimsdon Avenue, extending southwards from its junction with Aston Road, for a distance of 140 feet to point E on the map and extending northwards from its junction with Aston Road, for a distance of 285 feet to point F on the map.
