The Lewisham (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 1986

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough Lewisham on 23rd April 1986 made the above-mentioned Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by section 8 of and part 1 of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.
