

Cattle for Slaughter

4. (a) Each consignment of cattle shall be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with Annex F, Model II of EEC Directive 64/432 (as amended).

(b) Cattle for slaughter shall be licensed from the reception centre only to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter under the terms of a licence issued under Article 11 (5) of the Importation of Animals Order 1977.

General

5. Any person wishing to land animals in Great Britain under the terms of this licence must make arrangements for accommodation of the animals in advance with the occupier of the reception centre to which the animals are to be taken after landing.

6. The carrier of imported animals must notify the person in charge of the reception centre of the proposed time of landing, the number of animals and their description.

7. After arrival at the reception centre and before release from the reception centre is authorised by a veterinary inspector, all animals not being consigned direct to a slaughterhouse, must be treated to the satisfaction of an officer of the Secretary of State for Wales or a veterinary inspector with an approved product (for which there is a valid product licence granted under the Medicines Act 1968 permitting its sale and supply for systemic use to kill warble fly) in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions. Treatment shall be at the expense of the owner or person in charge of the animals.

The only exceptions to this requirement shall be for:

(a) Calves under the age of 12 weeks;

(b) Between 1st December and 14th March;

* (i) cows producing milk for human consumption;

* (ii) dairy cows within 28 days prior to calving;

* (No approved products are available to treat these categories of cattle between 1st December and 14th March.)

In the case of animals at (b) (i) and (b) (ii) above, treatment must be undertaken on the farm between 15th and 31st March. Three days notice of treatment must be given to the local Divisional Veterinary Officer so that he may arrange for the treatment to be supervised. Instruction to this effect will be issued with the movement licence at the reception centre.

8. All steers are exempt from brucellosis testing requirements.
