Thomas Ellis Way

- (i) West side, from its junction with Georgetown Hill for a distance of 490 metres in a northerly direction.
- (ii) East side, from its junction with Georgetown Hill for a distance of 435 metres in a northerly direction.
- St. James Way* (Southern Cul-de-sac), both sides, from its junction with Thomas Ellis Way for a distance of 15 metres in a westerly direction.
- St. James Way* (Northern Cul-de-sac), both sides, from its junction with Thomas Ellis Way for a distance of 15 metres in a westerly direction.
- Georgetown Hill*, north side, from a point 27 metres west of its junction with Thomas Ellis Way for a distance of 52 metres in an easterly direction.

GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

(Route B4471 at Llanhilleth and Aberbeeg) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles) Order 1986

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council in exercise of their powers under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, and of all other enabling powers intend to make the above named Order the effect of which will be to prohibit subject to certain exceptions any commercial vehicle the gross metric weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes, from proceeding in those lengths of road as set out in the Schedule to this Order. (Commercial vehicle means any vehicle mechanically propelled or not which is constructed or adapted for the carriage of goods.)

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to permit the use of the roads as set out in the Schedule to this notice, if the vehicle is being used:

- (a) for the conveyance of goods, persons or merchandise to or from properties situated on or adjacent to any part of any of the lengths of road or side roads having their principal access from such lengths of road;
- (b) for the purpose of agriculture or the haulage of timber on land adjacent to any of the lengths of road or side roads having their principal access from such lengths of road;
- (c) for the carrying out of the following operations:
- (i) building industrial or demolition operations;
 - (ii) removal of obstructions to traffic;
 - (iii) the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the roads;
 - (iv) the laying of any sewer, main or pipe or telegraphic line;
 - (v) for fire brigade, police or ambulance purposes;
 - (vi) in pursuance of statutory powers or duties;
 - (vii) for the garage, service or repair of the vehicle;
 - (viii) for a circus, fair or similar event;
 - (ix) for the conveyance of goods for sale from the vehicle.

The alternative route is via B4471 partly known as High Street, Llanhilleth to Crumlin Road Route R247, Newport to Brynmawr Road Route A467 to B4471 from its junction with the Newport to Brynmawr Road Route A467 to its junction with Victoria Road, Aberbeeg.

The draft Order, together with a plan showing the restricted roads, an alternative route together with a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be inspected at the Area Offices of the Blaenau Gwent Borough Council, Council Offices, Abertillery, and the County Hall, Cwmbran, during normal office hours (Monday to Friday).

GWENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Gwent County Council (Cwm Govilon, Bryn Awelon, Pantyfforest Estate Roads, Ebbw Vale) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986.

Notice is hereby given that the Gwent County Council propose to make an Order under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and all other enabling powers the effect of which will be:

- (i) To revoke the Gwent County Council (Brynawelon Road Area, Beaufort, Ebbw Vale) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982.
- (ii) To prohibit waiting at any time on those lengths of road as set out in the Schedule to this notice.

Exemptions will be provided in the Order to permit waiting for the purposes of:

- (a) Picking up and setting down passengers.
- (b) Loading or unloading goods.
- (c) The maintenance of the roads.
- (d) The supply of gas, water or electricity.
- (e) For emergency purposes.
