The Council of the Borough of Knowsley (Various Roads, Huyton) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1986

Notice is hereby given that on 12th May 1986 the Council of the Borough of Knowsley in exercise of its powers made an Order under sections 1 (1) and (2), 2 (1) to (3) and 4 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The Order which comes into effect on Monday, 19th

May 1986, makes it unlawful, except upon the direction or with the permission of a police constable in uniform, or of a traffic warden, to cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the following lengths of road:

- (b) to a disabled person's vehicle displaying a disabled person's badge;
- (c) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, and in connection with;
- (d) statutory powers and duties;
- (e) collection and delivery of postal packets;

and, where necessary for:

- (f) the maintenance of the roads and the services therein;
- (g) building operations; and
- (h) supplying gas, electricity and water.
