THE ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

The Birmingham-Great Yarmouth (A47) Trunk Road (Postwick-Blofield Dualling Compulsory Purchase Order (DE No. 3) 1986.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport in exercise of his powers under the above-mentioned Acts, on 9th May 1986 made a compulsory purchase Order, entitled as above.

The Order as made provides for the purchase of:

(a) the land described in the Schedule hereto for the purpose of:

(i) the improvement of the Birmingham-Great Yarmouth (A47) Trunk Road at Postwick in the District of Broadland in the County of Norfolk;

(ii) the improvement of other highways in the said District and County in pursuance of the Birmingham-Great Yarmouth (A47) Trunk Road (Postwick-Blofield Dualling Side Roads) Order 1986,

(iii) use by the Secretary of State in connection with such improvement of the said trunk road and other highways.

Copies of the Order as made by the Secretary of State and of the plan referred to therein together with copies of the above-mentioned Side Roads Order (with its accompanying plan) have been deposited and may be seen at all reasonable hours from 10th June 1986 to 1st July 1986, at the offices of the Director (Transport) at the address shown below; at the offices of Norfolk County Council, County Hall, Martineau Lane, Norwich; Broadland District Council, Technical Services Department, Thorpe Lodge, Yarmouth Road, Thorpe St. Andrew, Norfolk; at the Branch Libraries at Blofield and Brundall, and Sub-Post Offices at Witton, Blofield, Brundall, Great Plumstead and Yarmouth Road, Thorpe St. Andrew, Norfolk.

The Order as made becomes operative on the date on which this notice is first published, but a person aggrieved by the Order may, by application to the High Court within 6 weeks from the operative date, question its validity on the grounds:

(i) that the authorisation granted by the Order is not empowered to be granted, or

(ii) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by failure to comply with any statutory requirement relating to the Order.
