

## WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

(A) *The County of Wiltshire (Various Roads, Trowbridge) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1986*

(B) *The County of Wiltshire (Longfield Roundabout, Trowbridge) (One-way) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that on 12th August 1986 the Wiltshire County Council made Orders under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be as follows:

*Order (A)*

- (1) To prohibit waiting at all times on lengths of the following roads:

Ashton Street (West), Bradford Road, Brown Street, Canal Road, Cedar Grove, Charlotte Street, Clarendon Avenue, College Road, Court Street, Cross Street, Duke Street, Eastbourne Gardens, Eastbourne Road, From Road, Harford Street, Hilperton Road, Islington, Islington Gardens, Kennet Way, Longfield Roundabout, Palmer Road, Park Street, Post Office Access Road, Relief Road, Rutland Crescent, Seymour Road, Shails Lane, Union Street, Wesley Road, West Ashton Road, Westbourne Gardens, Westcroft Street, Withy Close, Wyke Road, Yeoman Way, Yerbury Street, York Buildings.

- (2) To prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Saturday on lengths of Ashton Street, Polebarn Road and Timbrell Street.
- (3) To prohibit waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday on lengths of Summerleaze, Westfield Road, and Yeoman Way.
- (4) To provide for limited waiting up to 1 hour with return prohibited within 1 hour between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Saturday on a length of Frome Road.
- (5) To prohibit loading and unloading between 8.30 a.m. and 9.15 a.m. and between 12.30 p.m. and 2 p.m. on Monday to Saturday, and also between 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. on Monday to Friday on a length of Roundstone Street.
- (6) To reduce the existing restrictions in Ashton Street, Polebarn Road and Wyke Road.
- (7) The Order will also revoke and re-enact as appropriate the existing restrictions prohibiting and restricting waiting on various other roads in Trowbridge.

*Order (B)*

To create a one-way traffic flow in a clockwise direction on the lengths of road surrounding Longfield House, viz. lengths of Longfield Road, Mortimer Street and the new length of road linking them.

Copies of the Orders and plans may be inspected at the Chief Executive's Department (Environment Section), County Hall, Trowbridge, during normal office hours.

Any person aggrieved by the Orders and desiring to question the validity of the Orders, or of any provision contained in the Orders on the grounds that they are not within the powers of the relevant section of the above Act, or on the grounds that any requirement of that section or of Part III of Schedule 9 of the Act, or any regulation made under the said Schedule has not been complied with in relation to the Orders may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Orders were made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

The Orders will be operative as from 1st September 1986.

## NORTH YORKSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

*The Council of the County of North Yorkshire (Prohibition of Heavy Vehicles) (Mill Bridge, Catterick) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that on 4th August 1986 the Council of the County of North Yorkshire made an Order under section 1 (1) and (2), 2 (4) and 3 (2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit any vehicle in excess of 7.5 tonnes gross vehicle weight from proceeding across Mill Bridge, Catterick.

A copy of the Order which comes into operation on 18th August 1986 together with a map showing the roads

affected may be examined at County Hall, Northallerton and at North Yorkshire County Council Divisional Office, 18 Green Howards Road, Richmond, during normal office hours.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act, or of any Instrument made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of 16th August 1986, make application to the High Court for the purpose.

## SECOND SCHEDULE

*Purpose of a Conservation Area*1. *Enhancement*

In designating an area as a Conservation Area the Council are required to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing its character or appearance in the exercise, with respect to any buildings or other land in the area, of any powers under the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 Part 1 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953, or the Local Authorities (Historic Buildings) Act 1962.

2. *Demolition of Building in a Conservation Area*

Any building within a Conservation Area not being a building falling within any of the exempted categories referred to in the Third Schedule hereto shall not be demolished without the consent of the Council.

An application for consent to the demolition of such a building shall be made to the Council as a separate application entitled 'an application for listed building consent' and shall not be taken to have been given as part of planning permission for redevelopment of the site.
