*The City Council of Liverpool (Hawkins Street, Grantham
Street and Coleridge Street) (Revocation and One-way Traffic)
Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that on 19th September 1986, the City Council of Liverpool made the above-named Order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, to become operative on 3rd October 1986, the effect of which will be:

- (a) to revoke the Orders specified in Column 1 of Schedule 1 to this Notice to the extent specified in Column 2 of the said Schedule; and
- (b) to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding in the lengths of roads specified in Column 1 of Schedule 2 to this Notice in a direction other than that specified in relation to the lengths of roads in Column 2 of the said Schedule.

A copy of the Order, the plan and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be inspected at the City Solicitor's Office, Room 34, Municipal Buildings, Dale Street, Liverpool, between the hours of 8.45 a.m. and 4 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the

powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 19th September 1986, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

Franciscan Way-St. Peters Street Link*

Notice is hereby given that the Ipswich Borough Council, acting as Agents for the Suffolk County Council under arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 in exercise of the powers of the County Council under section 23(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 intend to establish a Pelican Crossing to serve pedestrians in Franciscan Way, Ipswich.
