The New Town of Warrington and Runcorn: Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way over Footpath 25, Croft, Warrington.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing all public rights of way over the following route shown coloured red on the map hereinafter referred

That part of footpath number 25, Croft, passing over the track known as Silver Lane, starting at a point marked B on the plan being its junction with an unnamed track leading to New Hall Farm, at a point 250 metres north-west of the bench mark on the north-east corner of the building at New Hall Farm, immediately adjoining the southern edge of the unnamed track and running in a northerly direction for a distance of 312 metres to a point marked A on the plan. metres to a point marked A on the plan.

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS FROM THE NATIONAL LOANS FUND

The Treasury in pursuance of section 5 of the National Loans Act 1968 (as amended) hereby give notice that on or after 2 p.m. on 29th September 1986:

- Different rates of interest shall apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
