RESTRICTION OF WAITING ON BUS STOPS) (No. 1, 1982) (Amendment No. 3) Traffic Order 1986

Notice is herby given that the Council of the London Borough of Merton, after consultation with the Commissioner of Police of the Metropolis, have made on the 22nd October 1986 the above mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984. The Order will come into operation on 10th November 1986.

The general effect of the Order will be to further amend the Merton (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) Traffic Order 1982, so that waiting and loading restrictions are imposed on the bus stop situated on the south-west side of Commonside East, Mitcham from a point opposite the party wall of Nos. 209/211 Commonside East to a point 1 metre north-west of the party wall of Nos. 225/227 Commonside East. The said waiting and loading restrictions will apply between 7 a.m. and Midnight throughout restrictions will apply between 7 a.m. and Midnight throughout

The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply:

- (a) in relation to a vehicle being used to provide a London bus service, whilst picking up or setting down passengers; or
- (b) in relation to a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; or
- (c) in relation to any vehicle being used in the service of a local authority in pursuance of statutory powers or duties provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary in the exercise of such powers or the performance of such duties on that bus stop for the vehicle to wait on that bus stop; or
- (d) in relation to any vehicle being used in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation on or adjacent to that bus stop, the removal of any obstruction to traffic on or adjacent to that bus stop, the maintenance, improvement or reconstruction of the road in which that bus stop is situation, the laying, erection, alteration or repair on or adjacent to that bus stop of any sewer or of any main, pipe or apparatus for the supply of gas, water or electricity, or of any telegraphic line for the placing, maintenance or removal of any traffic sign, if the vehicle cannot conveniently and lawfully be used for that purpose in any part of any street which is not a bus stop or outside the prescribed hours; onr

in relation to any vehicle waiting for a period not exceeding two minutes to enable a person to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage;

Provided that if the said person is a person suffering from any disability of injury seriously impairs his ability to walk or who is blind, the vehicle may wait for so long as may be necessary to enable that person to walk to, to board or alight from the vehicle or load thereon or unload therefrom his personal luggage; or

- (f) in any case where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop, or is obliged to do so in order to avoid an accident; or
- (g) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

A copy of the Order, of the above mentioned Order of 1982 (and of the Orders which have amended that Order), a map identifying the area of the prohibition which is the subject of this Order and the Council's Statement of Reasons for making the Order, can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays until 2nd December 1986 in the Main Reception (Ground Floor), Crown House, London Road, Morden, Surrey.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or any provision contained therein on the ground that is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of that date on which the Order was made make application for the purpose to the High Court.
