Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 sections 1, 2 and 4 the A523 Trunk Road (Macclesfield) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1985

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order under Sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 on the Derby to Macclesfield, South of Stockport Trunk Road (A523) in the Borough of Macclesfield in the County of Cheshire.

The effect of the Order will be to:

- (a) prohibit waiting at any time on any day in the side and lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice. Loading will be prohibited between 8.00 am and 9.00 am and between 4.30 pm and 6.00 pm Monday to Saturday;
- (b) prohibit waiting at any time on any day on the side and lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice;
- (c) restrict waiting to 1 hour in any 3 hours between 8.00 am and 6.00 pm Monday to Saturday in the side and lengths of the trunk road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with any building, industrial or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic or the maintenance of the road or its services; to enable a vehicle to be used for fire brigade, ambulance or police purposes; to enable a vehicle to be used for the purpose of delivering or collecting postal packets; to enable a vehicle to be used by a local authority or a water authority in pursuance of its statutory powers or duties; to enable a vehicle to be used in connection with a wedding or funeral; to enable a person to board or alight from a vehicle and to enable a disabled persons' vehicle to wait for up to 2 hours.

Any person who desires to question the validity of, or of any provision contained in the Order, on the ground that it is not within the powers with respect to the Order conferred by the above Act, or on the ground that any requirement of, or of any instrument made under any provision of that Act has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the 15th December 1986 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.
