The changes of substance made by this Order are:

- (a) the definition of "harbour" in the 1974 Order is amended so as to include all inland waterways and not only those navigated by sea-going ships (Article 2(a));
- (b) Navyard Wharf, Harwich has been omitted from the list of ports at which authorised landings of animals may take place (Article 2(b));
- (c) Norwich is added to the list of airports at which authorised landings of animals may take place (Article
