## A PROCLAMATION,

Declaring the Continuation of the Cessation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, agreed on between Her Majesty and the Most Christian King, and enjoining the Observance thereof.

ANNE R.

**W**hereas for putting an End to this long and expensive War, and for restoring a General Peace, a Treaty has for some time been set on Foot, and is now carrying on at Utrecht; and whereas for preventing the Effusion of Christian Blood, and all the Events of War which might possibly intercept the Progress of that Negotiation, and for the better Securing the Trade of Our Kingdoms, and the Dominions thereunto belonging, It was agreed between Us and His Most Christian Majesty, That there should be a General Cessation of Warlike Actions and Enterprizes, and of all Acts of Hostility in general, between the Armies, Troops, Fleets, Squadrons, and Ships of Us and the Most Christian King, during the Term of Four Months, to Commence from the Eleventh Day of August last past, and to continue until the Eleventh Day of this Instant December, whereof We were pleased to give Notice by Our Royal Proclamation, bearing Date the Eighteenth Day of August last. And whereas, We and the Most Christian King, for the Reasons aforesaid, have agreed, That the said Cessation of Arms, as well by Sea as Land, shall be prolonged and continued for the Term of Four Calendar Months longer, to Commence from the said Eleventh Day of December, and to continue till the Eleventh Day of April, which will be in the Year of Our Lord One thousand seven hundred and thirteen. We have thought fit by and with the Advice of Our Privy Council, to Notifie the same to all Our Loving Subjects; and We do Declare, That Our Royal Will and Pleasure is, and We do hereby strictly Charge and Command all Our Officers both at Sea and Land, and all other Our Subjects whatsoever, to forbear all Acts of Hostility, either by Sea or Land, against His Most Christian Majesty, his Vassals or Subjects, during the said Space of Four Months, under the Penalty of incurring our High Displeasure.

Given at Our Court at St. James's, the 12th Day of December, 1712: In the Eleventh Year of Our Reign.

Vienna, Nov. 30. N. S. Yesterday being the Eve of St. Andrew, the Emperor, accompanied by the Knights of the Golden Fleece, made a Cavalcade to the Cathedral Church of St. Steven with great Magnificence. The same Solemnity was repeated twice this Day, after the manner which is prescribed in the ancient Records. His Imperial Majesty hath laid the first Stone in the Foundation of a new Church that is building, at which Ceremony he was attended by the Cardinals of Saxe Zeiss and Piazza, and the Forreign Ministers. Upon notice that a contagious Disease is broke out at Presburg and other parts of Hungary, Guards are ordered to be placed on the Frontiers of this Province, to hinder Passengers from coming out of that Country till they have performed a Quarentain: If the Infection should continue, it is thought the Court will remove from hence to Prague.

Frankfort, Decem. 8. N. S. On the first Instant Prince Eugene passed through this Place on his way to Vienna, and lay that Night at Hahnau. The French begin to make great Preparations in these Parts against the next Campaign, having already fill'd all their Magazines in Allatia by Contributions, which

which they raise in Corn, instead of Money. The Artillery and Ammunition of the Army of the Empire were transported to Philipsbourg. The Resident of Russia hath dispersed a Manifesto, in justification of the Seizure of Meurs. We are informed that the Garrison of that Place, hath lately received a reinforcement from Aix la Chapelle, and the Prussian Troops there, consist at present of above 1200 Men.

Brussels, Decem. 10. N. S. Two Days ago the Deputies of the States of Flanders arrived here, and brought the Council of State the consent of that Province to the ordinary Subsidy demanded of them for the Year ensuing. The Deputies from the States of Hainault, are also come hither upon the same occasion. Letters from Madrid of the 21st, bring an account, that General Wetzel who Commanded the Blockade of Girona, retired from thence upon the approach of Count Fiennes, with a Body of Ten thousand Men.

St. James's, Decem. 12. On Tuesday last the Queen arrived here from Windsor in perfect Health. On Wednesday the Marquis de Monteleone, who was sent hither by the King of Spain, had a private Audience of Her Majesty, to which he was introduced by the Right Honourable the Earl of Dartmouth; and afterwards he presented to Her Majesty, the Duke d'Attri, the Conde de Montejo, Marquis Grillo, Comte Bardi, and other Persons of Quality of his Nation.

Whitehall, December 11. 1712.

Whereas in the Returns made by several of the Colonels of the Army, relating to Officers who are Minors in their Regiments, they do exclude such as are of the Age of Sixteen, and a Nation that those who are of that Age are qualified to continue in Commission, although they have never served or done Duty in the Regiments to which they belong: This is therefore to declare, that it is Her Majesty's Intention and Meaning, by Her Orders signified to the respective Colonels in that behalf, that such Officers shall be deemed to be Minors, who, having obtain'd Commissions in the Army during their Minority, have not served or done Duty with the Regiments to which they belong, be they of what Age soever; therefore the respective Colonels are to take Notice, and govern themselves accordingly, in the Returns they are to make of the Officers who are Minors in their several Regiments.
