TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 13th February 1987, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 16th February 1987 to Friday, 20th February 1987, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.

6. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders. (1 SI)

EXPLANATORY NOTE:

Entitlement to social security benefits and supplementary benefits is affected by in-patient treatment in hospital. These regulations are intended to shorten the periods after which benefits payable in respect of a person in hospital are reduced. In future the periods of treatment after which the rates of benefit will be reduced will be 6 weeks instead of 8 weeks for the first reduction and 52 for the second reduction. (4 SI)
