Madrid, December 22. N. S. This being his Majesty's Birth-day, there was a great Appearance of Nobility at Court. On the Thirteenth an Express from Lisbon brought Advice, that the King of Portugal had ratified the Treaty for a Cessation of Arms with the Crowns of Spain and France, and that it would be publish'd there very speedily: Upon which it was proclaim'd here on the Sixteenth with the usual Solemnity. A Courier is lately gone through this Place towards Catalonia, with Orders for the Portuguese Troops to march homewards; and they are to return through Arragon and Castile. The Count de Estréle, a Member of the Council of State, died a few Days ago, in the Seventieth Year of his Age.

Vienna, Dec. 21. N. S. On the 18th, the King of Portugal's Minister notified to the Emperor and the two Empreſſes Dowagers the Birth of the Prince of Brazil, and great Rejoycings have been made at Court upon that occasion. Monsieur Matueof, Privy Counsellor to the Czar, is come hither with a private Commission from his Master, and has had an Audience of his Imperial Majesty who received him very graciously. On the 19th Marshal Daun arrived here from Italy. Last night Count Wratisslaw died after a long Sickness. We have received advice from Barcelona, that the British Troops, consisting of Two thousand Men, embark'd on the Eighteenth past for Port-Mahon. The same Letters add, that Gironne continued streightly block'd up, and that the Inhabitants were reduced to great Extremities for want of Provisions.

Utrecht, Jan. 10. N. S. On the 8th Instant, the Queen's Plenipotentiaries had a long Conference with those of France at the Earl of Strafford's House, in which their Lordships delivered to them the Draught of a Project for bringing the Empreſs home from Barcelona, and also for withdrawing the Imperial Troops out of Catalonia. And it is hoped this Affair will be regulated in such a manner as to prevent an Action in that Country, which our last Advices from France had given some Reason to apprehend. Yesterday the Ministers of the Allies met in the Town-house, as usual, after which the Plenipotentiaries of the States General had a particular Conference with those of Her Majesty. The Entertainments prepared by the Ministers of Portugal, to celebrate the Birth of the Prince of Brazil began Yesterday, and are to continue for three Days. Upon this occasion, they have shewn great Marks of Distinction to the English Gentlemen residing in this Town.

London, January 5. Last Night the Duke d'Aumont had a private Audience of Her Majesty, to which he was Introduced by the Rt. Hon. the Earl of Dartmouth, One of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, and was very graciously received.
