RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE
PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS
TO LOCAL AUTHORITIES

NOTICE

Treasury Minute dated 11th February 1987.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read section 3(2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 C.13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works Loan Commissioners shall bear interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quota at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 11th February 1987 and until the coming into operation of a further determination:
