#### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of Queen's College, in the University of Cambridge on 13th February, amending Statutes 20, 21, 23, 24 and 34 has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

The purpose of the Statute is to provide for the appointment of the Junior Bursar, Steward, Chaplain and Librarian for more than one year at a time. (16 SI)

#### TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 6th March 1987 at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the Tenderer on any business day from Monday, 9th March 1987 to Friday, 13th March 1987, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.

6. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders. (18 SI)
