

COLCHESTER BOROUGH COUNCIL
ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

Notice is hereby given that the Colchester Borough Council, as Agents for the Essex County Council, proposes to make the following Orders under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984:

- (i) The Colchester Borough (London Road and Montbretia Close, Stanway) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987, the effect of which will prohibit the waiting of vehicles at all times on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 1 to this notice. The Order will not prevent vehicles waiting for the purpose of loading or unloading goods, allowing passengers to board or alight or to enable works to be carried out in the roads. Exceptions in the Order will also permit the waiting of disabled persons' vehicles in accordance with the Orange Badge Scheme;
- (ii) The Colchester Borough (East Hill, East Street and East Bay, Colchester) (Urban Clearway) (Revocation) Order 1987, the effect of which will revoke the Borough of Colchester (Urban Clearway) Order 1972;
- (iii) The Colchester Borough (Box Junction) Order 1987, the effect of which will be to prohibit a person driving a vehicle into a "boxed area" marked on the carriageways of the junction of Crouch Street, Head Street, Headgate and St. John's Street, Colchester, and thereafter driving it in such a direction that it becomes necessary owing to the presence of stationary vehicles, for any part of the vehicle to remain at rest within the area.
- (iv) The Colchester Borough (East Hill, Priory Street and St. John's Street, Colchester) (Restriction of Loading and Unloading) Order 1987, the effect of which will:
- prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day on the sides of roads or in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2 to this notice for the purpose of loading or unloading; and
 - prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 9.30 a.m., 12.30 p.m. and 2.15 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the sides or length of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice for the purpose of loading or unloading.
- (v) The Colchester Borough (Various Roads, Colchester) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1987 the effect of which will:
- prohibit waiting at all times on specified sides of the lengths of roads in Schedule 4 to this notice;
 - prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays, inclusive, on specified sides of the lengths of roads in Schedule 5 to this notice; and
 - prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day on a specified side and length of road included in Schedule 6 to this notice.

Copies of the Orders, maps showing the lengths of roads to which the Orders relate and copies of the Council's Statement of Reasons for proposing to make the Orders may be inspected at my office between 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

Objections to any of the proposals, together with the grounds on which they are made, must be sent in writing to the undersigned within 21 days from the date of publication of this notice.

SCHEDULE 1

(No Waiting at Any Time on Any Day)

In the Borough of Colchester

London Road, Stanway on its south side from its junction with the western kerb-line of Montbretia Close westwards for a distance of 30 metres and from its junction with the eastern kerb-line of Montbretia Close eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

Montbretia Close, Stanway on its east side from its junction with London Road southwards for a distance of 49 metres and on its west side from its junction with London Road southwards for a distance of 15 metres.

SCHEDULE 2

(No Loading, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Any Day)

In the Borough of Colchester

East Hill, Colchester on its south side from its junction with the western kerb-line of Priory Street westwards for a distance of 15 metres and from its junction with the eastern kerb-line of Priory Street eastwards for a distance of 15 metres.

Priory Street, Colchester on both sides from its junction with East Hill southwards for a distance of 15 metres.

SCHEDULE 3

(No Loading, 8.30 a.m. to 9.30 a.m., 12.30 p.m. to 2.15 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. to 6.30 p.m., Mondays to Saturdays)

In the Borough of Colchester

St. John's Street, Colchester on both sides for its entire length.

The London Borough of Richmond-upon-Thames (Church Road and Bracken Gardens, Barnes) (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Experimental) Order 1987

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984 SECTION 9

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Richmond-upon-Thames on 23rd March 1987 made the above Order.

The effect of the Order is to upgrade the existing waiting restrictions from 8 a.m. to 6.30 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays to 8.30 a.m. to 12 midnight throughout the week at the junction of Church Road and Bracken Gardens, Barnes, with an extension of 9.14 metres (30 feet) into Bracken Gardens.

The Order will come into operation on 6th April 1987.

A copy of the Order, the Richmond-upon-Thames (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, the Order amending that Order, and the Council's statement of reasons for making the Order together with a plan showing the lengths of roads affected can be inspected at:

- the Offices of the Director of Technical Services, Regal House (Second Floor), London Road, Twickenham between 9.15 a.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday;
- Richmond Library, Little Green, Richmond during opening hours;
- Castelnuovo Library, 75 Castelnuovo, London S.W.13 during opening hours.

Copies of the Order may be obtained from the Department of Technical Services, Regal House, London Road, Twickenham TW1 3QB.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or any of its provisions on the grounds that it is outside the powers of the Act or that any of the requirements of the Act or regulations made under the Act have not been complied with, you may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

If the Order continues in operation for a period of 6 months or longer, the Council will consider whether the Order should continue in force indefinitely. If you wish to object to or make representation on the making of a permanent Order you should write giving grounds for your objection or representation to the Director of Technical Services, Regal House, London Road, Twickenham TW1 3QB, quoting reference T/TMO, to be received by 21st September 1987.
