The Greenwich (Waiting and Loading Restriction) (Amendment No.) Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Greenwich, hereinafter called the Council, propose to make the above-mentioned Order under sections 6 and 124 of and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order would be further to amend the

Greenwich (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, so

(a) waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited;
(i) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice;
(ii) at any time in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 2 to this Notice;

(b) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle in the lengths of streets referred to in;

(i) sub-paragraph (a)(i) above would be prohibited,

except on a Sunday;
(ii) sub-paragraph (a)(ii) above would be prohibited at any time; unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Council

or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is effected;

(c) the use of any vehicle or any animal or the wearing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, in the lengths of streets referred to in subparagraph (a) above, would be prohibited.

The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 2(a) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform or in certain circumstances, e.g. the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., fom roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders

etc. The usual exemption relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "Orange Badge" would apply.

St. Mary Street
between a point 20 metres south-west of the south-western
kerb-line of Rectory Place and its junction with John Wilson Street.

Vanbrugh Park

between a point opposite the common boundary of Nos. 54 and 55 Vanbrugh Park and its junctions with Stratheden Road and Westcombe Hill.

**Durnford Street** 

between its junction with Greenwich Church Street and a point 14 metres north-eastwards.

Conway Road
