Turin, January 7. N. S. The Count de Castillebarco, Envoy-Extraordinary from his Imperial Majesty to this Court, returned two Days ago from Milan, where he had been for some time: And by his Master's Command he hath acquainted his Royal Highness with the Design of withdrawing the Prussian and Saxon Troops out of Italy, and that in a short time the Emperor will replace them with the same number of his own Men. The Court of Vienna sent Directions for those Forces to march on the Twenty fifth of last Month, but they refused to obey, upon pretences that they have not received a sufficient Gratification for their Winter Quarters, and that no Orders are yet come to them from their own Masters. Lieutenant-General

Schulembourg, who Commands at Suza, is arrived here, and several other Officers are expected in a few Days from Com and Alexandria, to enjoy the Diversions of the Carnival, since their Presence at this time is not required at their Posts. Yesterday a Courier from Milan brought an Account of General Zumjungen's return from Vienna, with Orders to make the necessary Dispositions for the ensuing Campaign.

Berlin, January 14. N. S. His Majesty hath been pleased to appoint Monsieur Kameke, Great Master of the Wardrobe, to be Great Master of the Household. This is a new created Employment, which entitles the Person that enjoys it to have precedence of all the Officers of the Crown. Some time ago the King ordered Ten Men out of each Troop in all his Regiments of Horse to be sent hither, and on the Ninth they were assembled at Spandau, and disbanded there, to the number of Six hundred. On Wednesday last Monsieur Marshall set out for Utrecht. His Majesty hath named him to be his Ambassador to the Court of France as soon as the Peace is concluded; and at the same time he is to have the Title of Privy-Councillor of State, being at present only Privy-Councillor of War. Monsieur Bruce, General of the Muscovite Forces, who had been kept here for some time by an Indisposition, is gone to join the Army.

Hanover, January 17. N. S. Advices from Holstein bring an Account, that after the burning of Altena, the Swedes withdrew to Pinnenberg, and from thence to Gluckstad, and having drawn out the Troops which were in Garrison in those two Places, they went on to Itzehoe. These Letters add, that the Czar was returned from Hamburg to his Army in Holstein, which was marching in conjunction with the Danes and Saxons to attack the Swedes, but it is thought the latter will retire under the Cannon of Toningen, upon the approach of their Enemies, whose Forces are said to amount to Fifty five thousand Men. The Confederate Generals have made great Complaints to Count Steinbock of the burning of Altena, representing to him that they did not act after that manner in Pomerania, and desiring to be informed what Reasons induced him to it, that they may take their Measures accordingly: He answered, at first, that it was done by way of Reprizal for the Danes having burnt the City of Straden, but as that happened during the Siege, he said afterwards it was because he could not carry off such large Magazines as were in the Place, and that for the future he would not destroy any Town, if he was not forced to it by the like Practices of his Enemies. The King of Denmark is gone from Rensbourg to Fredericksad.

Utrecht, January 24. N. S. On Wednesday the 18th the Ministers of the Protestant Allies met at the Lord Privy Seal's House, and had a long Conference upon the Means which have been already used since the beginning of the Treaty of Peace for advancing the Interest of the Protestant Religion, as also upon what Steps are proper to be taken for that effect, in the present Conjunction of Affairs. The same Afternoon the British Plenipotentiaries were in Conference with those of France, and soon after with the Ministers of his Imperial Majesty, who seems at last disposed to come into the Queen's Measures for procuring a general Peace: In
