

order to which, Count Sinzendorff hath drawn up some Proposals for setting on foot a Negotiation between the Imperial and French Ministers, which their Lordships delivered to the latter on the 21st, in a meeting at the Lord Privy Seal's House: And the Day following they acquainted the said Count and Baron Kirchmer how far they had proceeded in that Affair. Yesterday the Ministers of the Allies met in the Town-house, as usual, and in the Evening the Plenipotentiaries of Prussia had a long Conference with those of the Queen, in which they expressed their Master's Inclination to conclude a Peace, whenever Her Majesty shall think fit to finish her own. The Ministers of Savoy, pursuant to their Instructions, have returned Thanks to their Lordships on the behalf of his Royal Highness, for the great Care that hath been taken of his Interests, and given Assurances that they are ready to concur in whatever Steps the Queen shall judge proper for bringing the Peace to a speedy conclusion.

London, January 23. The Earl of Linlithgow is unanimously elected by the Peers of Scotland to sit in Parliament, in the room of the Duke of Hamilton and Brandon deceased.
