Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 16th April 1987 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the South Ribbles Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable.
