#### UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

Statutes made by the Governing Bodies of :

1. Exeter College, in the University of Oxford on 6th July 1987, amending Statutes III and IV; and
2. Brasenose College, in the University of Oxford on 10th July 1987, amending Statutes

have been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of their having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

The purposes of the amendments are:

- (i) to permit election to short-term Tutorial Fellowships at Exeter College, Oxford; and
- (ii) to widen the categories of persons eligible for Supernumerary and Junior Research Fellowships at Brasenose College, Oxford.
