Lee Brockhurst Boreholes

Notice is hereby given that the Severn-Trent Water Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") is about to apply to the Secretary of State for the Environment for an Order under section 23 of the Water Act 1945.

The general effect of the Order will be to authorise the Authority to continue and maintain boreholes on land situate in the civil parish of Lee Brockhurst in the district council of North Shropshire in the county of Shropshire comprising an area of 0.23 hectares or thereabouts and being the enclosures either in part or in total numbered 6063 on the 1:2500 Ordnance map of 1972 sheets ref. NOTICE OF PROPOSALS TO VARY A LICENCE TO ABSTRACT WATER

Notice is hereby given that the Severn-Trent Water Authority (hereinafter called "the Authority") whose head office is at Abelson House, 2297 Coventry Road, Sheldon, Birmingham B26 3PU has formulated proposals for varying its licence serial number 18/54/4/986 which authorises abstraction from underground strata (Triassic Sandstones) by means of a borehole at Moston Park in the

parish of Lee Brockhurst, Shropshire at National Grid ref. SJ 555 275 for public water supply purposes.

The proposed variation is to authorise an additional borehole at National Grid ref. 5553 2753 and to increase the maximum authorised abstraction from 4,546 cubic metres per day and 1,314,000 cubic metres per annum to 9,000 cubic metres per day and 2,735,000 cubic metres per annum.

A copy of the proposals in the form of a draft varied licence and of any map, plan or other document prepared in connection with them may be inspected by the public free of charge at the Authority's offices at the Shelton Waterworks, Shelton, Shrewsbury, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 5th October 1987 and ending on 2nd November 1987 inclusive.

Any person who wishes to make representations about the proposals should do so in writing to the undersigned at the address below before the end of the said period. At the expiry of the said period, the Authority will be entitled to pass a resolution by virtue of which the licence shall be deemed to be varied unless the Secretary of State for the Environment, either in consequence of any representations made with respect to the proposals, or otherwise, requires an application for the variation of the licence to be made to him.
