Madrid, March 27. N. S.

Treaty for the Evacuation of Catalonia by the Imperial Troops having been agreed to, the Duke de Popoli, Captain of the Italian Guards, is appointed to be Governor and Captain-General of that Province, and he intends to go thither in a few Days. It is faid the Baron de Capre is to be made Governor of Barcelona, the Marquis de Queilus of Tarragona, and Comte de Hercelles of Cardona. The King hath fent Orders for Sixteen thousand Men, quarter'd on the Frontiers of Catalonia, to take the Field, Five thousand of which are to march by Tortofa, and the reft by Lerida and Cervera; and all the Officers in this City are commanded to repair to their refpective Regiments, under Penalty of being cafhier'd. His Majefty under Penalty of being cashier'd. His Majesty hath approved Count Bergeick's Project for building Ships in Biscay, and hath already sent a Person thither with Orders to have Wood cut down for that purpofe. An Express is arrived here from the Marquis Ceva Grimaldi, who commands at Balaguer, and brings an Account, that on the 13th the Empress, with her whole Court, embark'd on Board the British Squadron, without any manner of Diflurbance. They write from Cadiz, that four Dutch Men of War, which have taken on board the Regiments of their Nation at Gibraltar, are ordered to cruize on that Coast for fix Weeks, in hopes of meeting the Spanish Flota; and it is reported the Algerines have twelve Sail eruizing there with the fame design.

Dantzick, March 29. N. S. On the 24th the Marshal of the Crown died at Warsaw : He is to be fucceeded by the Palatin of Mazure, Ambaffador from the Republick to the Ottoman Port, who is upon his return home. King Augustus hath writ to the Great General to accompany the Turkish and Tartarian Envoys from Leopol to Warlaw; by which it is judged his Majefty will continue at that Place for foms time longer. The Favourers of the Swedes give out, that these Eavoys have commission, among other things, 1ft, To ask King Augustus why he broke the Treaty of Altranstad. 2dly, To en-quire what number of Muscovites are still remain-ing in Poland. 3dly, To agree upon a fecure Pas-fage for the King of Sweden through Poland into his own Dominions. 4thly, To inform themselves, whether the Republick, in case of a Rupture be-tween the Grand Signior and the Czar intende to tween the Grand Signior and the Czar, intende to be concerned in the War. The Starofte Bobruski hath obtained his Pardon of the King. The Bilhop of Infland is gone Ambaffador to Vienna, and the Bishop of Cujavia is to go soon with the same Cha. rafter to Utrecht. We have received Advice, that Mareschal Czeremetof was march'd from Smolensko with the Muscovite Horse, and had passed the River Donin. He was to be followed by all the Infantry, in order to post Himself near the City of Olof.

Berlin, April 4. N. S. Yefterday the King went from hence towards Magdeburg, in order to review the Troops that are lately come from Italy. His Ma-jefty hath declared Count Christopher Dhona General of the Foot, and Monfieur de, Vaine Lieutenant General. Monfieur Bartholdi, and Monfieur and to the States General, are recalled ; and his Majefty's Secretaries at Vienna and the Hague are to continue at those Places, with the Character of Refidents.

Hanover, April 7. N. S. His Electoral Highners often takes the diversion of Hunting near this Place. Major General Hamerstein, who was sent to Berlin with Compliments of Condoleance upon the Death of the late King of Prussa, and to Congratulate his prefent Majefty upon his coming to the Crown, is on his return home. The new King hath made a Prefent to the Elector of a fine Sett of Horfes, and another to the Electoral Prine, with Affurances, that he will preferve a conftant Friendship with them. He continues to augment his Forces confiderably, which gives tome Jealoufie to his Neigh-bours. Yetterday a Swedith Officer from Bender paffed through this Place without Stopping. He is going to Hamburgh with fome Difpatches from the King of Sweden to the Administrator of Hole ftein. Monfieur Van der Goes, Envoy from the States General to his Danish Majelty, having procured leave to go into Holland, fet out from hence this Morning for the Hague. The Officers, who are still in this Electorate, have received Orders to go with their Recruits, on the 15th Inflant, to wards the Low Countries. They write from Hufung that Monfieur Goertz, first Minister of the Admitnistrator of Holstein, had twice defired an Audience of the King of Denmark without obtaining it, but at the request of General Flemming, notice was git ven him that he should be foon admitted to his Ma+ jefty.

Hamburgb, April 7. N. S. Two Days ago Ba-ron Gbertz arrived here from Holitein, having obr tained leave of his Danish Majefty to go into Fon-ningen, and to bring from thence all the Goods belonging to the Administrator of Holstein, together with his own. The disposition is made for Attacking the Swedes, who are again Posted at Gardingen. The King of Denmark and King Augustus contribute Four thousand Horse towards it, under the di rection of Lieutenant General Bauditz. Prince Menzikoff, with Ten thousand Muscovite Foot, is to command the Attack, and if it fucceeds, Ton-ningen is to be Bombarded immediately after. Count Flemming hath put off his return hither, till this Action is over. There is at prefent fome mifunderflanding between the King of Demnark and Prince Meneikoff, Some Days aga his Majefty fent Monfieur Holft, one of his Rovy Council, to tell him, that if he did not keep his Men in better Difcipline, he should be obliged, in concert with King Aut gustus, to make a l'eace with the Swedes, in order to avoid the entire Ruin of his own Provinces, which are almost destroyed by the Mulcovites. To which the Prince answered. That his Majefty could. impute the Diforders committed by those Troops to no body but humfelf, fince he had not provided for their Maintenance, as he was obliged to do when they entered Holftein. The Mulcovites have burneyAn clam, Wolgall, and Gartz, without sparing the Tombs of the vancione Dukes of Pomerania. They threaten to do the like in all the Cities they get into their Pollefion, Since the Allies have refuted to treat with Gount Steinbock, for want of his has Hymnen, Envoyse from this Court to the Emperor I ving a full Power, they have been acquainted that Count

It is faid the Duke of Wirtemberg, who commanded the Danish Forces in Flanders, is to have the Government of Bremen, and that General Scholten is to be made Governor of Copenhagen. Letters from Vienna bring an Account, that his Imperial Majefty- was retired to Laxemberg, one of his Hunting Houses, to avoid the Contagion which had spread into several Streets of the City, and if it should continue, he intends to go to Inspruck the Capitol of Tirol, where he will wait for the arrival of the Empress.
