Rates of interest on loans from The National Loans Fund.

The Treasury in pursuance of section 5 of the National Loans Act 1968 (as amended) hereby give notice that on or after 20th October 1987:

MISUSE OF DRUGS ACT 1971, SECTION 12

DIRECTION PROHIBITING EXERCISE OF POWERS IN
RELATION TO CONTROLLED DRUGS

GUNWANT SINGH GURAM

In accordance with section 12(4) of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State gave the following direction which came into force on 14th October 1987:
"Whereas Gunwant Singh Guram, a pharmacist within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971, whose registered address is 2A Kinnaird Avenue, Bromley, Kent, was on 15th May 1987 convicted of certain offences under the Act;

Now, therefore, in pursuance of section 12(2) of that Act I hereby direct that the said Gunwant Singh Guram be prohibited from having in his possession, manufacturing, compounding and supplying and from supervising and controlling the manufacture, compounding and supply of any controlled drug within the meaning of the Misuse of Drugs Act 1971 which was on 15th May 1987 such a controlled drug.

This Direction does not extend to the doing of anything in circumstances in which it might lawfully be done without being a pharmacist."

- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act

he may within 6 weeks of 23rd October 1987 apply to the High Court for suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The highways to be stopped-up are at Wrexham in the county of Clwyd and are:

1. that length of the highway known as Guildhall Street which extends from its junction with Henblas Street in a general easterly direction for a distance of 75 yards.
2. that length of highway known as Chester Street being lay-bys and footways on the westerly side extending from a point 25 yards north of the junction with Henblas Street in a general northerly direction for a distance of 72 yards.
