THE HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The A483 Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road and the A489 Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road (Dolfor Road Junction Improvement, Newtown, Side Roads) Order 1987

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that in relation to the above-mentioned Trunk Roads at Dolfor Road Junction, Newtown in the county of Powys, he has made under sections 14 and 124 of the Highways Act 1980 an Order, the effect of which is:

- (a) to authorise him:
- (i) to construct new highways,
 - (ii) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
 - (iii) to provide new means of access to premises, and
- (b) to provide for the transfer of the said new highway to the County Council of Powys as from the date on which he notifies the Council that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

Copies of the Order and of the relevant plan have been deposited at the Welsh Office, Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL and at the offices of Powys County Council, County Hall, Llandrindod Wells, Powys and Powys County Council, Highways and Transportation Department, The Park, Newtown, Powys where they are open to inspection free of charge at all reasonable hours.

Copies of the Order the title of which is "The A483 Swansea-Manchester Trunk Road and The A489 Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road (Dolfor Road Junction Improvement, Newtown, Side Roads) Order 1987", can be obtained from the Welsh Office, Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act, or of regulations made thereunder, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks from 3rd November 1987 or within 6 weeks from the date of publication of this notice, if such a period shall expire late, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

*The New Town of Warrington and Runcorn
Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way over Part of
Footpath No. 37, Burtonwood, Warrington*

Notice is hereby given, that the Secretary of State for the Environment, in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, proposes to make an Order extinguishing all public rights of way over the following route shown coloured red on the map hereinafter referred to:

That part of footpath No. 37, Burtonwood starting from a point marked 'A' on the map (approximately 10 metres east of Sankey Brook and 30 metres north of Cromwell Avenue) and running in a north-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 890 metres to a point marked 'B' (approximately 5 metres north of the northern kerb-line of Europa Boulevard and 250 metres south of Sankey Brook Culvert).
