Notice is hereby given that Hereford and Worcester County Council propose to make these Orders under section 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3), 3(1), 4(1) and (2) of, and Part IV of Schedule 9 to the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers, the effect of which will be:

1. (London Road, Worcester) (Bus Stop) (Clearway) (No.) Order 1987

To prohibit vehicles, other than buses, from waiting in that length of the south-western side of London Road in the City of Worcester in the county of Hereford and Worcester which extends from a point 10 metres south-east of its junction with Bath Road for a distance of 30 metres (98 feet) in a northwesterly direction, where the carriageway at that stop is marked:

- (a) as a bus stop; and
- (b) with a broad yellow line near to the edge of the carriageway.

While the Order remains in force it enables the Council at any time to lay or to remove the authorised markings at or from any bus stop in a specified road or length of road or to adjust the position in that road or length of road of the authorised markings, as traffic conditions may require

Other vehicles will be permitted to wait at bus stops with

authorised markings, where necessary:

- (a) for the removal of an obstruction to traffic;
- (b) in certain circumstances in exercise of statutory powers;
- (c) in certain emergencies; and
- (d) for police, fire brigade or ambulance purposes.

2. (Bath Road, Worcester) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987

To prohibit waiting at any time on those lengths of the south-eastern side of Bath Road in the City of Worcester in the county of Hereford and Worcester specified in the Schedule to this Notice.

Exemptions in the Order will permit waiting for the purpose

- (a) picking up and setting down passengers;
- (b) in certain circumstances in exercise of statutory powers;
- (c) delivering and collecting mail by Post Office vehicles;
- (d) delivering and collecting furniture and effects with police consent:
- (e) any building or demolition operation, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the roads and the supply of gas, electricity and water maintenance of any telecommunication apparatus;
- (f) the fire brigade, ambulance or police services;
- (g) the pursuance of statutory powers or duties (if no other road can be conveniently used).

An exemption of the Order also permits the waiting by disabled persons' vehicles displaying a badge issued under the Local Authority's Orange Badge Scheme for a limited period of two hours, return prohibited within a further period of one hour.
