TREASURY

Rates of interest on loans from The National Loans Fund. The Treasury in pursuance of section 5 of the National Loans Act 1968 (as amended) hereby give notice that on or after 6th November 1987.

- i. Different rates of interest shall apply according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
- ii. The lowest rates of interest satisfying the conditions laid down in subsection (3) of the said section 5 shall be—
