LAMBETH BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Lambeth (Prescribed Routes) (No. 1) Experimental Traffic Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that the Lambeth Borough Council on 6th November 1987 made the above-mentioned Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by section 8 of and Part I of Schedule 5 to the Local Government Act 1985.

The effect of the Order will be to prohibit all vehicles, other than pedal cycles, from entering Mount Nod Road at its junction with Leigham Court Road.

The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above will not apply in respect of anything done:

(a) with the permission or at the direction of a police officer in uniform; or

(b) in accordance with any restriction or any requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

The Order provides that in pursuance of Section 10(2) of the The Order provides that in pursuance of Section 10(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the Director of Civil Engineering and Public Services or some person authorised in that behalf by him, may if it appears to him or that person essential in the interests of the expeditious, convenient and safe movement of traffic or for preserving or improving the amenities of the area through which any road affected by the Order runs, modify or suspend the Order or any provision thereof.

Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied

relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

NEWHAM LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

Newham (Prescribed Route) (No. 5) Experimental Traffic Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that the London Borough of Newham on 9th November 1987 made the above-mentioned Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Order will be to prohibit goods vehicles the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes from entering any street within the area specified in Schedule to this Notice (the prohibited area).

The prohibition referred to in paragraph 2 above will not

- (a) to any vehicle entering any prescribed street to load or unload or to gain access to off-street garaging within the prohibited area;
- (b) to a vehicle being used for purposes in connection with the statutory powers or duties of a local authority or the supply of gas, water, electricity or a telecommunications system provided that in all the circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to enter the prohibited area.
- (c) to anything done
- (i) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform;
- (ii) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.
