NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 SECTION 210

Metropolitan Borough of Stockport (Footpath 80, Torkington, Hazel Grove) Public Path Diversion Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as 'the Order') made on 19th November 1987 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Council of the Metropolitan Borough of Stockport as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification will be to:

direct the existing public footpath running from a point adjacent to Offerton Road (Point A) in an easterly direction for 70 metres to Point B, to a line running from Point A in a south-easterly direction for 35 metres to Point C then in an easterly direction for 51 metres to Point B (total distance 86 metres).

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Information Centre, Civic Hall, London Road, Hazel Grove, Stockport and the Enquiry Desk, Town Hall, Stockport between 8.30 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. Monday to Friday. Copies of the Order and map may be purchased.

Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Director of Administration, Stockport Metropolitan Borough Council, Town Hall, Stockport SK1 3XE before 18th December 1987 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Metropolitan Borough Council of Stockport may instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment confirm the Order itself. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be submitted with the Order.

NEW TOWNS ACT 1981

WARRINGTON AND RUNCORN DEVELOPMENT CORPORATION

Compulsory Purchase of Land in Sandymoor (Keckwick) Runcorn

Notice is hereby given that the Warrington and Runcorn Development Corporation on 26th October 1987 made the Warrington and Runcorn Development Corporation Sandymoor Compulsory Purchase Order No. 3 1987 under section 101(a) of the New Towns Act 1981. They have submitted this Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation and if confirmed the Order will authorise them to purchase compulsorily the land described below for the purpose of developing the new town of Warrington and Runcorn or incidental thereto.

A copy of the Order and of the accompanying map may be seen at all reasonable hours at New Town House, Buttermarket Street, Warrington, Cheshire.

Any objections to the Order must be made in writing to the Secretary of State for the Environment, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1 3EB, before 19th December 1987 and should state the title of the Order and the grounds of objection.

The Secretary of State is not required in every case to arrange for a public local inquiry to be held or for objections to be heard by a person appointed by him for that purpose. It is important, therefore, that any objections should include a full statement in writing of the grounds on which the objection is made, as the objector may have no further opportunity to make such a statement.

Any owner or occupier of any of the land to which the Order relates may (whether or not he makes an objection to the Order) send to Warrington and Runcorn Development Corporation of New Town House, Buttermarket Street, Warrington, Cheshire a request in writing that, in the event of the Order being confirmed by the Secretary of State, he be served with a Notice stating that the Order has been confirmed and naming a place where a copy

of the Order and of the map or maps and any descriptive matter annexed thereto may be seen. Any such request must state the name and postal address of the owner or occupier making it, must state the nature of his interest in the land and must include sufficient particulars to enable the extent and boundaries of his land to be identified.
