NOTICE OF PUBLIC INQUIRY — 15th December 1987

*The County of Dorset (Traffic Management) (Various Roads
Dorchester) Order 1987
Pedestriansation of South Street, Dorchester*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council published proposals on 17th July 1987 under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be to:

(a) Prohibit all vehicles at all times except for loading by goods vehicles at off street premises between 5.30 p.m. and 10 a.m. and except for licenced market traders on the following roads:

- (1) Cornhill
- (2) South Street (Part)
- (3) Durngate Street (Part)

(b) Prohibit all vehicles at all times except for loading by goods vehicles and access to off street premises on:

- (1) New Street
- (2) South Street (Part)
- (3) Durngate Street (Part)

(c) Prohibit waiting at any time on part of South Street

(d) Prohibit loading between 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. except for postal vehicles delivering and collecting postal packets on part of South Street.

(e) Introduce on street parking places for the disabled on parts of:

- (1) New Street
- (2) Trinity Street
- (3) South Street

Following objections to the above-mentioned Order, in accordance with the Local Authorities' Traffic Orders (Procedure) (England and Wales) Regulations 1986, The County Council hereby give notice that a Public Inquiry will be held in connection with the proposals.

The Inquiry will commence on 15th December 1987 at 10 a.m. at County Hall, Dorchester in No. 1 Committee Room.

The Inspector appointed to hold the Inquiry is Major General D. B. Wood, C.B., M.A., C.Eng., F.I.Mech.E., F.R.S.A.

A copy of the order, as drafted, a copy of the relevant map and a copy of the Authority's statement for reasons for proposing to make the order can be inspected during normal office hours in the County Surveyor's Department at County Hall, Dorchester and at the West Dorset District Council Offices, High West Street, Dorchester.

Any person who wishes to make written representations in connection with the Inquiry should make them in writing and addressed to the Inspector, Major General Wood c/o Chief Executive County Hall, Dorchester.

NOTE

The County Council on 17th July 1987 also published proposals under the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which would be to amend the existing Order in operation in South Street solely to prohibit buses from proceeding along Cornhill and South Street, Dorchester.

The order referred to above is the subject of the Inquiry, includes the prohibition in respect of buses together with other measures, all of which the County Council wishes to implement at the same time. The County Council, therefore, does not propose to proceed with the Order which relates to only the prohibition of buses.

*The County of Dorset (Upton Court, Lytchett Minster
(One Way Street) Order 1987*

Notice is hereby given that the Dorset County Council have made an Order under sections 1(1) and (2) and 2(1) to (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

This Order which comes into effect on 20th November 1987 provides that no vehicle shall proceed along Upton Court, Lytchett Minster, from its junction with Poole Road (B3067) and its junction with the southern side of the access road to the Health Clinic and Library in any direction other than northerly.

The alternative route necessitated by this proposal is via Ballam Close and Heights Road.

A copy of the Order and a plan showing the length of road affected may be examined during normal office hours, Monday to Friday at:

1. Dorset County Council, Transportation and Engineering Department, County Hall, Dorchester, Dorset.
2. Purbeck District Council, Council Offices, Westport House, Wareham, Dorset.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it, on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks from the date of this notice apply to the High Court for this purpose.

*The County of Dorset
(Chettell Way and Pigeon Close, Blandford St. Mary)
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987*

Notice is hereby given that the Dorset County Council have made an Order under section 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

When the Order comes into effect on 20th November 1987 waiting will be prohibited at any time on the following lengths of road in Blandford St. Mary at:

Pigeon Close—

- (a) on its north-western side—between junction with C31 Bournemouth Road and a point 18 metres south-west thereof;
- (b) on its south-eastern side—between its junction with C31 Bournemouth Road and a point 48 metres south-west thereof, between points 80 metres and 108 metres south-west thereof;
- (c) on its eastern side—between its northern junction with Chettell Way and a point 17 metres south thereof;
- (d) on its western side—from its northern junction with Chettell Way south-eastwards to a point 15 metres into the southern leg of Pigeon Close;
- (e) on its southern and eastern side from a point 139 metres east of its northern junction with Chettell Way westwards and thence into its southern leg for a distance of 15 metres.

Chettell Way—

- (a) on both sides—between its junction with C31 Bournemouth Road and a point 18 metres south-west thereof;
- (b) on its southern side—between a point 16 metres east and a point 16 metres west of its northern junction with Pigeon Close;
- (c) on its north-eastern side—between points 48 metres and 125 metres south-east of a point opposite its junction with Beckett Close.

Exemptions are included in the Order for picking up or setting down passengers, loading or unloading goods, disabled persons' vehicles bearing the relevant 'orange badge', Post Office vehicles delivering and collecting mail, emergency service vehicles, the maintenance of the road, the supply of gas, water or electricity and works to any telegraphic line.
