Copies of the Order (as confirmed) and of the relevant plans may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of the Humberside County Council, County Hall, Beverley, at Hedon Public Library, and at the Department of Transport, City House, New Station Street, Leeds LSI 4JD.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act 1980 or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may, within 6 weeks of 24th November 1987, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

THE IMPORTED FOOD REGULATIONS 1984 HEALTH MARK: ISRAEL

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Secretary of State for Wales acting jointly in exercise of the powers conferred on them by the Imported Food Regulations 1984 (SI 1984, No. 1918), give notice that they hereby recognise, subject to the conditions hereinafter set out, the health mark described in Part 1 of the Schedule hereto for the importation from Israel of poultry meat and meat products as showing:

- (a) that the fresh meat to which they relate, or the meat from which the meat product to which they relate was prepared, was derived from mammals or birds inspected before and immediately after death and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Ministers; and
- (b) that the dressing, packing and other preparation of the fresh meat or meat product was carried out with all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to health.
- The said health mark is recognised subject to the following conditions:
- (i) recognition applies only to fresh poultry meat and meat products imported from Israel but does not apply to any such meat and meat products derived from mammals or birds killed when wild;
- (ii) where the health marks are in the form of stamps or labels, recognition will apply only if the stamps or labels have not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as a health mark.
- Recognition of the health mark is restricted to the extent shown in Part 2 of the Schedule hereto.
- The Notices published in the London Gazette dated 5th March 1985 and 2nd February 1986 are hereby revoked.

For fresh poultry meat and meat products, the health mark shall consist of a stamp, label or mark as set out below:



PART 2

For poultry meat: to health marks completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers:

Slaughterhouses and cutting premises 003, 004, 005, 008, 009, 011, 012, 016, 018, 019, 020, 021, 031.

For meat products derived from poultry meat and which do not contain other meat: to health marks completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers: 022, 047, 052, 101, 103, 104, 113, 119, 131, 151, 161.

For meat products (excluding canned meat): to health marks completed by the insertion of one of the following establishment numbers: 151, 161.
