Notice is hereby given that the Islington Borough Council on 24th November 1987 made the above-mentioned Orders under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

The general effect of the Bus Lanes Order would be to prohibit all vehicles from entering and proceeding in any area of the carriageway (to be known as the "bus lane"), lying within or adjacent to the lengths of St. John's Way specified in Schedule 1 to this Notice and between the south-eastern kerb-line of that road and a longitudinal single white line (which will be broken by gaps or a broken white line opposite adjoining roads and at a pedestrian crossing) marked on the carriageway thereof, between

7 a.m. and 10 a.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive.

The prohibition will not apply to:

(a) a local service, a scheduled express carriage, a school bus or a works bus; or

(b) a coach (a vehicle constructed or adapted to carry 12 or

more passengers); or (c) a dial-a-ride vehicle (a vehicle providing a service for the carriage of disabled persons and those accompanying them);

(d) a pedal cycle; or

(f) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes if it is reasonably necessary for that vehicle to enter

(h) a vehicle being used for purposes in connection with the statutory powers or duties of a local authority or the supply of gas, water or electricity, or in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to a bus lane, provided that in all the circumstance it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to enter the bus lane; or (i) a vehicle;

(i) while postal packets addressed to premises adjacent to the bus lane are being unloaded from that vehicle or

having been unloaded therefrom, are being delivered; or (ii) while postal packets are being collected for loading on the vehicle from premises or posting boxes adjacent to the bus lane or, having been so collected, are being

(j) any vehicle which enters the bus lane for the sole purpose of waiting for as long as may be reasonably necessary to enable a person suffering from any disability or injury (including blindness) which seriously impairs his ability to walk to board or alight from that vehicle; or (k) any vehicle which enters or proceeds in the bus lane:

(i) from any road if that vehicle forthwith leaves the bus lane through any can in the longituding single white line.

lane through any gap in the longitudinal single white line or through the broken white line situated opposite and adjacent to the junction of that road with that bus lane, or if there is no such gap or broken white line, at a point opposite that road; or

(ii) from any part of St. John's Way which is not comprised in the bus lane through any gap in the longitudinal single white line or through the broken white line if that vehicle forthwith enters the road which lies opposite and adjacent to that gap or broken white line, at a point opposite that road if the vehicle forthwith enters that road; or
