*The Hampshire (Borough of Basingstoke and Deane)
(Hazelwood Drive, Basingstoke) (Prohibition of Driving)
Order 1987*

Notice is hereby given that on 27th November 1987 the Basingstoke and Deane Borough Council pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the County Council of Hampshire made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which is to prohibit any motor vehicle, moped or bicycle to use, enter or leave that length of Hazelwood Drive which extends for a distance of 30 metres in a westerly direction from its easternmost end.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation 1984, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made apply to the High Court for this purpose.

KIRKLEES METROPOLITAN COUNCIL

*The Kirklees Metropolitan Council
(Traffic Regulation) (No. 38) Order 1986*

Notice is hereby given that the Kirklees Metropolitan Council made the above-named Order on 17th November 1987 under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 the effect of which is to prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in that length of New Street (west side) at Skelmanthorpe which extends from its junction with Huddersfield Road (B6116) for a distance of 27.75 metres in a southerly direction. The Order contains the usual exemptions.
