WELSH OFFICE

The Trunk Road (A479) (Bronllys, Powys) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that on 20th November 1987, the Secretary of State made the above Order which will come into force on 21st December 1987.

The effect of the Order is as stated in Notice 1SI in the *London Gazette* No. 50169, dated 20th June 1985.

If any person desires to question the validity of the Order, or of any provision contained therein, on the grounds:

- (a) that it is not within the powers of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984; or
- (b) that his interests have been substantially prejudiced by a failure to comply with any of the requirements of that Act he may within 6 weeks of 20th November 1987 apply to the High Court for the suspension of quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

The Trunk Road (A48) (Station Road, Chepstow, Gwent) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1, 2 and 4 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to prohibit (with certain exceptions) the waiting of vehicles in that length of trunk road described in the Schedule to this Order.

A draft Order, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Monmouth District Council, Mamhilad House, Mamhilad Park Estate, Pontypool.

Objections, specifying the grounds on which they are made, and quoting ref. WR15/3/357, must be sent in writing to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, by 24th December 1987. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection, it should be borne in mind that

the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

SCHEDULE

That length of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A48) situated at Chepstow in the County of Gwent which extends from its junction of the Chepstow Inner Relief Road in a general north-westerly direction to its junction with Nelson Street. (3 SI)

The Trunk Road (A48) (Station Road, Chepstow) One-way Traffic) Order 1987

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 2 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the proposed Order will be to extend the current one-way restriction on that length of the London-Fishguard Trunk Road (A48) known as Station Road at Chepstow in the County of Gwent to its junction with the Chepstow Inner Relief Road.

The Trunk Road (A48) (Station Road, Chepstow) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1973 which imposes the current restriction, will be revoked and its provisions re-enacted by the proposed Order.

A draft Order, a copy of the Order being revoked, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Monmouth District Council, Mamhilad House, Mamhilad Park Estate, Pontypool, Gwent, and Monmouth District Council, Area Office, Hightrees, Chepstow.

Objections, specifying the grounds on which they are made, and quoting ref. WR15/3/351, must be sent in writing to the Welsh Office, Highways Directorate, Roads Administration Division, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL by 24th December 1987.
