Turn right onto the A4109 and proceed westwards for a distance of approximately three quarters of a mile to its junction with the C197 in Onliwyn at which point turn right onto the C197 and proceed northwards for a distance of approximately three quarters of a mile to reach the southapproximately three quarters of a mile to reach the southwestern end of the restricted length of road;

and vice versa for vehicles bound in a northerly direction (towards the A4221).
