**SOUTHWARK LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL**

Notice of Traffic Management Order*

The London Borough of Southwark (Prescribed Routes) (No. 3)  
Traffic Order 1988.

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Southwark on 1st March 1988 made the above-mentioned Order under section 6 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 as amended by the Local Government Act 1985.

2. The effect of the Order will be to:—

- (a) prohibit all vehicles from turning from Lower Road into the un-named road which links Lower Road to Surrey Quays Shopping Centre.
- (b) to prohibit all vehicles from entering Lower Road from the un-named road which links Lower Road to Surrey Quays Shopping Centre.

3. The prohibition in paragraph 2(a) above will not apply to:—

- (a) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes in an emergency; or
- (b) a public service vehicle being used to carry passengers for hire or reward at separate fares; or
- (c) a coach; or
- (d) a pedal cycle.

4. Nothing in the Order will apply in respect of anything done:—

- (a) with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform; or
- (b) in accordance with any restriction or requirement indicated by traffic signs placed on the highway by or on behalf of the Metropolitan Police.

5. A copy of the Order, which will come into operation on 6th March 1988 can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the end of 6 weeks from the date on which the Order was made in the Municipal Offices, Larcom Street SE17 1RY and the Information Centre, Town Hall, Peckham Road, SE5 8UB.

7. Any person desiring to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the relevant powers of the Road Traffic Regulations Act 1984 or that any of the relevant requirements thereof or of any relevant regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, make application for the purpose to the High Court.

**SOUTH TYNESIDE METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL**

*South Tyneside Metropolitan Borough Council (East Back Fowler Street and South Back Winchester Street South Shields) restriction of Waiting Order 1988*

Notice is hereby given that South Tyneside Metropolitan Borough Council propose to make an Order under section 1(1), (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and of all other enabling powers.
