HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road A470 (Llanidloes By-Pass) Order 1988

The Cardiff-Glan Conwy Trunk Road A470 (Llanidloes By-Pass, Side Roads) Order 1988

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made the following Orders:

1. An Order under section 10 of the Highways Act 1980 and all other enabling powers providing that a road about 335 metres in length which he proposes to construct at Llanidloes in the county of Powys starting at a point on the existing trunk road 300 metres west of the access track to Berth-lwyd Farm then going north-east to a point on the existing trunk road 50 metres east of the access

track to Berth-lwyd Farm shall become a trunk road as from the date when this Order comes into force.

2. An Order under sections 12, 14, 125 and 326(2) of the Highways Act 1980.

(a) Authorising him:

- (i) to carry out the improvement of highways;
- (ii) to stop up highways;
- (iii) to stop up highways temporarily;
- (iv) to construct new highways, and to construct new highways for temporary purposes;
- (v) to stop up private means of access to premises, and;
- (vi) to provide new means of access to premises; and
- (vii) to revoke the Newtown-Aberystwyth Trunk Road (Llanidloes By-Pass Side Roads) Order 1972 published on 1st June 1972.

(b) To provide for the transfer of each new highway, except those new highways constructed for temporary purposes, to the County Council of Powys. Each transfer shall take effect from the date on which the Secretary of State notifies the Authority concerned that the new highway has been completed and is open for through traffic.

(c) Authorising him to close the highways constructed for temporary purposes at the end of one month from the date on which he notifies the County Council of Powys (in whose area the highways are situated) that they are no longer needed for public use.
