UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of Exeter College, in the University of Oxford on 8th February 1988, amending Statute IX has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its submission is published in accordance with the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

The purpose of this amendment is to permit surplus revenue of trusts to be used for general educational purposes. (8 SI)

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Securities Office, Bank of England, Threadneedle Street, on Friday, 11th March 1988 at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877 and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

(being a multiple of half of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Notification will be sent on the day of the Tender to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amount due in respect of an accepted Tender must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash, banker's draft payable through the Town Clearing or by cheque drawn on the Bank of England, not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative

Bills are to be dated and on which they are to be collected from the Securities Office.

6. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Securities Office, Bank of England.

7. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right to reject any Tenders. (12 SI)
