Barking Town Centre Action Area Local Plan

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971 (AS AMENDED)

Old Bexley Conservation Area—Extension

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Bexley has by resolution of 11th November 1987 varied the extent of the Old Bexley Conservation Area by the additional designation of the area of Old Bexley as described in the Schedule hereto as a Conservation Area under the provisions of section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971.

The effect of such designation is that:

1. Permission is needed from the Council to demolish most buildings within the conservation area.
2. Any person proposing to work on trees in the conservation area is required to give 6 weeks prior notification to the Council of his intention, unless the trees are already protected by a tree preservation order, in which case an application for consent will be required.
3. The Council becomes under a duty to formulate and publish proposals for the preservation and enhancement of the conservation area.
4. Planning applications for development which would in the opinion of the Council affect the character or appearance of a conservation area must be given publicity and representations received in consequence taken into account in determining the application.

A copy of a plan of the Old Bexley Conservation Area as extended may be seen at the Civic Offices, Broadway, Bexleyheath or at the Manor House, The Green, Sidcup on Mondays to Fridays during normal working hours.
