TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACTS 1971-74

Walberswick Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Suffolk Coastal District Council as district planning authority have designated the following area as a Conservation Area under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 (as amended). Conservation Areas are areas of special architectural or historic interest within which the relevant authorities are required to pay special attention to the desirability of preserving or enhancing their character or appearance:

Walberswick, an extended area since the first Conservation Area was designated in 1973, from the locality of the Church in the west to Ferry Road and the river in the east.

The precise boundary of the above area is defined on a map which may be seen during normal office hours at the address below, which map supersedes that dated 21st August 1973. The designation comes into effect of the date of the publication of this notice and it will be registered in the Register of Local Land Charges.

Notice is hereby given that the above Acts provide that non-listed buildings and parts of buildings (with certain exceptions) within Conservation Areas may not be demolished without the consent of the local planning authority. An application for consent to the demolition of such a building must be made as a separate application for conservation area consent, whether or not it is accompanied by a planning application for redevelopment. The Acts also provide that anyone wishing to cut down, top, lop or uproot any tree (with certain exceptions) within a Conservation Area must give the District Council 6 weeks notice of his intention. A notice under these provisions must state the work proposed and must give sufficient particulars to identify the tree concerned.

Planning applications involving development which is considered to affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Area will be advertised by the local planning authority for public comment. Applications for the erection of buildings will not normally be accepted in outline form by the authority, who will seek to ensure that all alterations, redevelopment and any new development are of a high architectural standard and enhance the character of the designated area. In addition, statutory undertakers are asked to pay special attention to the character and appearance of the area in the provision and maintenance of their respective services.

The effect of the Order as confirmed is to divert the public footpath running from Southgate Chase Allotments to Chase Side, Southgate to a line running from Southgate Chase Allotments around the proposed ASDA Store to Chase Side, Southgate.

This Order becomes operative as from a date to be determined by the London Borough of Enfield but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the ground that it is not within the powers of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or any Regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the confirmation of the Order, he/she under section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 within 6 weeks from 10th March 1988 make application for the purpose to the High Court.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The County Council of Avon (Avon Ring Road, Stage 111A) (A4174 Classified Road) (Side Roads and other works) Order 1988

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Avon hereby give notice that they have made, and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation, an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980 for authorising the Council:

- (a) to carry out improvements to Deanery Road and Baden Road;
- (b) to stop-up lengths of Deanery Road and Baden Road;
- (c) to construct new highways to replace lengths of Deanery Road which are to be stopped-up;
- (d) to stop-up private means of access leading to fields adjacent to Deanery Road;
- (e) to provide new means of access to the said fields;

all on or in the vicinity of the route of the classified road which the Council are proposing to construct between A420 Deanery Road and a point 35 metres south of Baden Road in the district of Kingswood.
