The Folkestone-Honiton Trunk Road (A27) (Windhover Roundabout to Southampton City Boundary and Park Gate Link Detrunking) Order 1988

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980 AND ACQUISITION OF LAND ACT 1981

Notice is hereby given that Public Local Inquiries in connection with the Orders mentioned below will be held by Brigadier J. N. Holden (a person appointed for the purpose by the Secretary of State for Transport) beginning at 10 a.m. on Tuesday, 10th May 1988, at The Central Hall, Warwick Lane, Coventry to hear representations from statutory objectors (as defined in the Highways (Inquiries Procedure) Rules 1976) and from any other persons having an interest in the land the subject of the compulsory purchase order, and also, at his discretion, to hear representations from any other persons who may desire to appear and be heard.

The Orders are Orders which have been made by the Coventry City Council under the above-mentioned Acts and submitted to the Secretary of State for Transport for confirmation and are:

The City of Coventry (Coundon Wedge Road) (Side Roads) Order 1987. This is an Order under sections 14 and 125 of the Highways Act 1980, which, if confirmed, will authorise the Coventry City Council:

- (i) to carry out the improvement of highways;
- (ii) to stop up highways;
- (iii) to construct a new highway;
- (iv) to stop up private means of access to premises, and
- (v) to provide a new means of access to premises,

all in the vicinity of the route of the Classified Road which the Council are proposing to construct from Tollgate Roundabout at the junction of Birmingham Road and Holyhead Road to the junction of Brownhill Green Road and Long Lane, Coventry.

The City of Coventry (Coundon Wedge Road) Compulsory Purchase Order 1987, notice of the making of which was published on 13th and 20th August 1987. This Order is an Order under sections 239, 240, 250 and 260 of the Highways Act 1980 and under section 2 of the Acquisition of Land Act 1981 which, if confirmed, will authorise the Council of the city of Coventry to purchase compulsorily the land described therein for the purpose of the construction of a new highway in the city of Coventry between the junction of Birmingham Road and Holyhead Road (at the Tollgate Roundabout) and the junction of Brownhill Green Road, Long Lane and Wall Hill Road to include a roundabout and link to the Jaguar Factory at Browns Lane, the construction of a new roundabout junction to connect the said new length of highway with existing highways at Brownhill Green Road, Long Lane and Wall Hill Road and for the purpose of the construction and improvement of highways and the provision of new means of access to premises, all at Coventry in pursuance of the above-mentioned Side Roads Order.

Copies of the above-mentioned Side Roads Order and Compulsory Purchase Order and of the plans referred to therein have been deposited and may be seen at all reasonable hours free of charge at the offices of the Coventry City Council, City Secretary's Department, Council House, Coventry CV1 5RR and at the offices of the Director (Transport), Department of Transport, West Midlands Regional Office, No. 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL.

Proceedings on the above-mentioned Orders are being taken concurrently by virtue of section 257 of the Highways Act 1980.

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby directs that any person who intends at the inquiries to submit that any highway or proposed highway to which the Orders or either of them relate should follow an alternative route, or that, instead of improving, diverting or altering a highway to which the Orders or either of them relate, a new highway should be constructed on a particular route, shall send to him at the Department of Transport, West Midlands Regional Office, No. 5 Broadway, Broad Street, Birmingham B15 1BL, not later than 19th April 1988, sufficient information about the alternative route or the route of the new highway, as the case may be, to enable it to be identified. Failure to comply with this direction will entitle the Secretary of State and the person holding the inquiries to disregard so much of any objection as consists of such a submission. The Secretary of State is not empowered to endorse any such alternative, but the information will enable him to take a fully informed view of the Orders before him.
