## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

*The County of Northumberland (Aydon Road, Corbridge)  
(Extension of 30 m.p.h. Speed Restriction) Order 198*

Notice is hereby given that The County Council propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2), 82(2)(b), 83(2), 84(1) and (2)(b), 85(2), 87 and Part III of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order, if made, will be to extend the 30 m.p.h. speed limit on Aydon Road (B.6321) Corbridge from its present termination point, which is 30 metres north-east of the Aydon Road/Crofts Avenue junction, north-eastwards for 700 metres to a point 100 metres south of the centre of the A.69 overbridge.

Exemptions are included in the Order for police, fire and rescue and ambulance purposes.

Full details are included in a copy of the draft Order which, together with a map showing the length of road involved and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order, may be examined at the Post Office, Corbridge during normal opening hours, at the Offices of the Chief Executive, Tynedale District Council, Council Offices, Hexham House, Hexham and at the address shown below during normal office hours until 11th April 1988.

## ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1984

*The County of Northumberland (Howick-Boulmer Coast Road,  
U3019) (Prohibition of Driving and Revocation) Order 198*

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Northumberland propose to make an Order under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) and (2) and Part III of Schedule 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984.

The effect of the Order, if made, will be to prohibit any vehicle from proceeding in that length of the Howick-Boulmer Coast Road, U3019 from Howick, Seashouses to Boulmer. Exemptions will be included in the Order to allow access for motor cycles, agricultural vehicles, vehicles of commercial fishermen, the coastguard, Boulmer Volunteer Rescue Service, disabled drivers' vehicles, fire and rescue, ambulance and police vehicles, and vehicles to be used for building operations, road maintenance and workings by statutory bodies.
