*Barking Town Centre Action Area Local Plan*

Notice is hereby given on 10th February 1988, the London Borough of Barking and Dagenham adopted the above-named local plan, as modified by the Council.

The plan became operative on 10th February 1988, but if any person aggrieved by the plan desires to question its validity on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by Part II of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, or that any requirement of the said Part II or of any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the adoption of the plan, he may, within 6 weeks from the date of this notice, make an application to the High Court under Section 244 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971.

BOROUGH OF EASTBOURNE

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT

*Extension of Meads Conservation Area (St. John's Road)*

Notice is hereby given in pursuance of Section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 (as amended), that the Eastbourne Borough Council on 22nd February 1988 determined that the areas described in the schedule to this notice are areas of special architectural or historic interest, the character or appearance of which it is desirable to preserve or enhance, and have as from that date accordingly designated the said areas as extensions to the existing Meads Conservation Area.

The effect of the designation is that where any application for planning permission for development of land in or adjacent to the Conservation Area is made to the Council and either the development would, in the opinion of the Council, affect the character or appearance of the Conservation Area, or the development is of a kind specified by the Secretary of State, the application will be subject to the special procedure set out in Section

28 of the Town and Country Planning Act, 1971. This deals with the publication of notice of the proposed development in a local newspaper and the display of a notice on or near the site. Furthermore, apart from a small number of exceptions, any person intending to undertake the demolition of a building or part thereof situated within the Conservation Area must first apply for Listed Building Consent to the Local Planning Authority. In addition, any person intending to cut down, top, lop, or uproot any tree situated within the Conservation Area must first give six weeks notice of his intention to the Local Planning Authority.

A map of the Conservation Area (Plan No TP9/8/88077) may be inspected free of charge during normal office hours at the office of the Director of Technical Services at 68 Grove Road, Eastbourne.
