TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL REGULATIONS 1976

Pedestrianisation of a length of Elm Road Seaforth Liverpool

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that, on the application of Sefton Metropolitan Borough Council he has made an Order entitled "The Extinguishment of Vehicular Rights (Metropolitan Borough of Sefton) (No. 1) Order 1988". The Order comes into operation on 17th March 1988 and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to this Order) on a length of Elm Road, Seaforth, Liverpool.

If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 17th March 1988, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 17th March 1988 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Sefton Metropolitan Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the Council at its above address within a period of 6 months from 17th March 1988, unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.

The Stopping Up of Highways (County of Essex) (No. 4) Order 1988

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that, on the application of Kemsley Whiteley and Ferris, he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping up of Highways (County of Essex) (No. 4) Order 1988" authorising the stopping up of part of White Horse Lane, Witham to enable development consisting of the construction of a car park to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to Nicholson's (Ilford) Ltd by Braintree District Council.

Proposed Stopping Up of a length of Temple Street, Blackpool

Proposed Stopping-up of Highways at Stockbridge Village, Liverpool
