HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The London-Brighton Trunk Road (A23 Pyecombe Side Roads) Order 1986, Variation Order 1988

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that, in relation to the new trunk roads to be constructed by him and the Trunk Road (A23) to be improved by him in the county of West Sussex, he has made under sections 14, 125 and 326 of the Highways Act 1980 an Order which varies the London-Brighton Trunk Road (A23 Pyecombe Side Roads) Order 1986 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Order") by authorising him to provide an additional means of access along the route of the bridleway labelled B on site plan 1 referred to in the principal Order, that bridleway to be created subject thereto. His authority to improve the Burgess Hill to Pyecombe Road (A273) is also slightly varied in its extent.
