The parking spaces will be available for the following classes of

vehicles: Motor cycles, motor cars and invalid carriages as defined in section 136 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and motor vehicles constructed or adapted solely for the purpose of carrying goods but not exceeding 30 hundredweight unladen weight.

This Order will come into operation on 14th March 1988.
